

Drone Flying Policy

The operation of drones at the Port of Fraserburgh should only be done in compliance with the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) requirements.

The [CAA website](#) gives full details and anyone wishing to fly a drone at the port should contact Fraserburgh Harbour Commissioners in advance.

A drone flown on a commercial basis such as conducting aerial work or to take photographs for sale requires the operator to be licensed by the CAA and Fraserburgh Harbour Commissioners will require confirmation that a licence is held.

All drone flying must comply with the [Dronecode](#) which sets out the regulations in brief, including that drones with cameras must not be flown within a specified distance of people, vessels or structures and cannot be flown over congested areas.

Prior to any flying being authorised, Fraserburgh Harbour Commissioners HSE department must be in possession of a risk assessment and method statement for the intended operation,

Permission will not be granted to carry out any drone flying within the boundaries of Fraserburgh Harbour until Fraserburgh Harbour Commissioner are satisfied that all conditions have been met.
